CITY HALL REMAINS CLOSED

On March 17, 2020 Governor Andy Beshear Signed an Executive Order declaring a state of emergency in the Commonwealth, due to the outbreak of COVID-19 virus, a public health emergency.

In addition to closing a number of "Public Facing" businesses, he also ordered the closing of "in-person" government services. As of Wednesday, March 18, 2020 at 5 p.m., City Hall has closed their doors to the public. The parks and playgrounds are also closed to the public. Police and Fire services will continue as normally as possible. Citizens are advised that if they call and ask to speak with an officer for a non-emergency, the citizen may be asked for a telephone number. The officer may then (depending on the circumstance) call that individual to gather more information. This is for the protection of the general public

City Hall and Public Works personnel are still working as much as possible to take care of City business. We will resume normal operations as ordered by the Governor.

Citizens are asked to pay their water bills either by mail, (300 West Main Street, Vine Grove, KY 40175), on-line (www.vinegrove.org), by phone (844-863-7359), or in the drop box located at 300 West Main street. We appreciate your cooperation. To open or close accounts, please call (270) 877-2422. We apologize for the inconvenience.

Please be aware that the City takes the needs of our citizens very seriously, and we are concerned for their well-being. We recognize that many of our citizens are suddenly without work, and dealing with their own pressures. If you need an extension or to set up a payment plan, please call us at (270) 877-2422, and we will do what we can to work with you.

CITIZENS REMINDED OF LEASH LAWS

Officials of the City of Vine Grove are asking citizens to be aware of local leash laws. Dogs are known to be quite territorial, and even the most mild mannered dog can become aggressive when someone infringes upon their perceived territory.

Pedestrians often have no defense when dealing with an animal that feels threatened. Citizens are asked to be mindful of their pets, and to maintain control of them at all times.

Please take note of the following ordinance:

90.02 ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE.

- (A) No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane, or alley, or upon unenclosed land, or permit it to go on any private yard, lot, or enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot, or enclosure.
- (B) The owner of an animal who permits it to run at large in violation of this section is liable for all damages caused by the animal upon the premises of another.

Animals running at large are also at risk of being hit by a car, and getting lost or stolen.

VINE GROVE TO CONTINUE INSTALLING NEW WATER METERS

The City of Vine Grove has begun to install new water meters throughout the entire city within the past few weeks. Many of the meters currently being used are more than ten (10) years old, and are not very accurate. In addition, workers are forced to read the meters manually, which is inefficient and time consuming. It currently takes four workers more than a week to read the meters for the entire city.

The new meters are digital, and much more accurate. The technology surrounding the new meters will allow one person to read the meters for the entire city in one day. This will free up our small Public Works Department for other tasks such as filling pot holes, mowing, and general repairs and maintenance.

Citizens should be aware that in some cases, workers will be required to dig in order to replace their meters. If that happens, workers will return to repair the damage, once the dirt has had time to settle.
