CITY REMINDS CITIZENS TO PAY WATER BILLS

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, Governor Andy Beshear has issued a number of Executive Orders aimed at dealing with the virus. On May 8, 2020 he issued Executive Order # 2020-323.

This executive order, in part, directs all utilities to cease cutoffs for nonpayment and mandates waiver of all late fees for the duration of the state of emergency.

Most citizens have dutifully paid their water bills despite the order, and we thank you. But there are some who have not. The City understands that many people have been left without work, and we would not want to place undue hardship on anyone. However, citizens need to be aware that even though the City is not able to attach late fees or interrupt service for non payment during the pandemic, once the Executive Order is lifted, those missed payments will become due.

For those citizens, it is important for you understand that you must contact the City and make payment arrangements **BEFORE** we are allowed to return to business as usual. Once that happens, we will begin cutting off service for delinquent accounts. **Anyone who has not made payment arrangements before we begin cut-offs, will be required to pay the balance in full before service will be restored.**

The money generated by water bills pays for the water the City of Vine Grove purchases from Hardin County Water District # 1. Without that revenue, we cannot pay our bills. It also pays for many of the services provided by Public Works.

VINE GROVE CONSIDERS STORMWATER UTILITY

On Tuesday, July 22, 2020, the Vine Grove City Council held a public hearing to discuss the possibility of a proposed stormwater utility. A representative from Heritage Engineering was present to share information gathered during a study his firm did on behalf of the City.

During the presentation, it was reported that there are at least twenty-five (25) projects that need to be completed, if funding were available.

There are miles of storm pipe and dozens of inlets in the city that are beyond their design life. Pipes transporting stormwater runoff along with debris like tire particles, sand and gravel, road salt, and other chemicals will not last forever. For decades, we have enjoyed the low annual maintenance costs of the aging system. Because it has lasted so well, proactive inspection and maintenance have been an afterthought. We only notice the system when a pipe fails and our road or sidewalk is closed. Then we want it fixed tomorrow.

For residential properties, an average impervious surface area for the city is calculated to establish an Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU). The base residential stormwater utility fee is established by elected officials and may be assessed annually on a property tax statement or monthly on a utility bill. Heritage Engineering is recommending a \$5.00 per month fee.

It was noted during the meeting that as the City continues to grow, so will the problems with stormwater. It has become essential that we address these issues before they become any worse.

CITY OFFERS SAFETY TIPS FOR HOT WEATHER

Summer months are usually quite busy for families, with work and activities for the children, even with the slow down due to the Covid Pandemic.

The City reminds everyone to be safe during these hot days, especially as we go about our business wearing masks. The best way to cool off is air condition, if it's available.

Be sure to stay hydrated, drink before you feel thirsty, and avoid alcohol. Replace salt lost from sweating by drinking fruit juice or sports drinks.

Wear sunscreen; sunburn affects the body's ability to cool itself. Avoid spending time outdoors during the hottest part of the day, usually between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. Don't push your body too hard, pace yourself.

For those working outside, try to stay in the shade if possible. Watch out for your co-workers for symptoms of heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Be sure to take breaks and cool down.

Please remember that children and pets should never be left alone inside a car. The temperature inside a parked car can climb very quickly, and become deadly within minutes.
