Vine Grove is anticipating a busy event year for 2021. During the month of May, we will display flags throughout our downtown honoring our fallen military. APRIL IS CLEANUP MONTH

April is "Clean-up Month". The City encourages citizens to clean up their yards, and spruce up their homes. Please remember Border's Disposal will be happy to pick up some items, but there are guidelines: 1.) Customer's accounts must be in good standing to receive pick-up services. 2.) Tree limbs and shrub trimmings must be bound together in four-foot sections 3.) Grass clippings and leaves must be bagged.

If you live in the City limits of Vine Grove, it is mandatory to have trash pick-up through Border's Disposal only. All items must be bagged before setting it out to the curb. 
SAFE ROOM AVAILABLE TO ALL CITIZENS

Citizens who do not have access to a basement or any other protection during severe weather are encouraged to take advantage of the safe room, which is located at the Vine Grove Fire Department, 513 Highland Avenue.

The Safe Room was constructed to accommodate approximately 500 people, on a short-term basis. It is not intended to be a long-term shelter, but it will give refuge during extreme weather events.

CODERED EMERGENCY SYSTEM

CodeRED is an emergency notification service that notifies residents and businesses by phone about emergency situations. The service is used for any emergency notification such as severe weather, utility outage, evacuation notices, missing or lost persons, fires, floods, etc. You can easily sign up for this free service by visiting: www.vinegrove.org/codered.
