Vine Grove City Hall Citizens who do not have access to a basement or other protection during severe weather are encouraged to take advantage of the safe room, which is located at the Vine Grove Fire Department, at 513 Highland Avenue.

> The Safe Room was constructed to accommodate approximately 500 people, on a short-term basis. It is not intended to be a long-term shelter, but it will give refuge during extreme weather events.

Citizens need not wait for someone to be on the scene to open the doors, as the doors may be unlocked remotely by Fire Chief Steve New. The moment he receives notification that severe weather is on the way, he can unlock the door remotely, thereby allowing citizens immediate access to safety.

emergency number: 270-351-4477. This is the phone number to Radcliff Dispatch whom dispatches our Vine Grove police officers. There is not always someone available in the department at all times. Any voicemails, or Facebook messages to the police are received too late.

Also, any after hours calls for Public Works need to be directed to dispatch as well. Dispatch will call our maintenance department in an emergency such as a sewer back up, or disruption in water service.
